5 Factors to Consider

<p>Pre-screening Carriers</p>  <p>If you're unfamiliar with auto carriers, finding the right one can be challenging and time consuming.</p>		
<p>Liability</p>  <p>Motor carriers have statutory liability with the shipper. Working directly with the motor carrier can provide greater understanding of liability coverage and, perhaps, greater peace of mind.</p>		
<p>Scheduling</p>  <p>Since motor carriers own the equipment used in the transportation of automobiles, they have more control over scheduling pickups and deliveries. If you have a lot of flexibility with dates, times and locations scheduling may be less of a determining factor for you.</p>		
<p>Customer Service</p>  <p>Motor carriers and brokers may approach customer service differently. The important thing to know is who you can contact with questions, concerns, and instructions until your shipment is complete.</p>		
<p>Deposits</p>  <p>If your plans aren't firm, you may want to consider how your deposit will be handled if your plans change. Brokers often require non-refundable deposit fees while carriers often allow you to cancel prior to pick-up with a full refund.</p>		

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
